HIGHWAY REPORT:

Superintendent Dennis raises the question if anything can be done to have bills paid if meetings, such as last December, are cancelled. When the bills don't get paid on time, lines of credit get cut off, making it difficult to purchase much needed items.

The Town of Castile has another truck coming up for sale in the Spring. It has 70,000 miles. The Sterling would be replaced by a new truck. It is believed they will be asking around \$150,000 for the truck. What can be done about a loan? A new truck is at least 18 months away from delivery once ordered.

Where is the sale of the gravel pit at?

The town board has asked the Clerk to email the lawyer and ask exactly what needs to be done to sell.

A few bids have been collected for a new grader. The current grader is now 28 years old, with untold hours. The equipment payment line was removed from the budget, and the equipment line needs to be maintained. CHIPS will pay for a grader; the Town will need to pay the interest. The prices are based on Government contract. The CAT grader is 171 hp, the John Deere is 155hp. Superintendent Dennis is looking for 6-wheel drive.

Employee handbook issues changes.

The employees are requesting that the personal days be changed from 2 to 4. The employees currently only have 7 holidays.
